perts working side by side to develop programs designed to meet the personal needs of your child is why we can provide such high quality teaching and learning. Your sup-

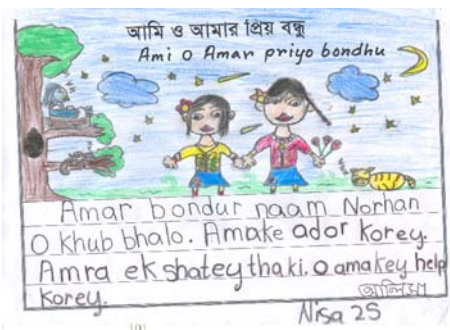
port and understanding of late start mornings, which we know can be inconvenient, is greatly appreciated by staff and your children who are the real beneficiaries.

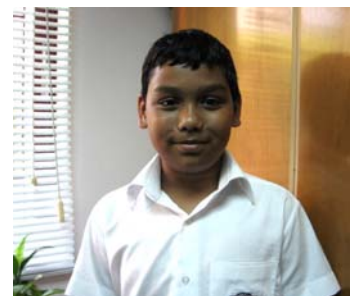
